As I reflect on all that we experienced at the revival and all the ways in which the preaching inspired and challenged us, I automatically thought of the teaching from this part of the Sermon on the Mount, all this talk about bearing good fruit or bad fruit. I think we can all agree that we want to bear good fruit in everything we do. What good fruit will our revival bear? If we just say how much we enjoyed it but leave it there, where's the fruit? Another way to ask this question is, "What's the 'so-what' of our revival?"

My prayer is that the fruit the revival bears is good fruit for us as individual believers, for us as a community of faith, and for the community and world around us. I pray that our "so what" may look like a renewed commitment to discipleship with personal and communal spiritual practices. I pray that our "so what" may look like a renewed focus on reaching out to others in our community with the Good News of Jesus Christ. I pray that our "so what" may look like a renewed dedication to building the Kingdom with God so that everyone will know the abundant life that Jesus offers.

I hope that you are reflecting on what your experiences mean for you going forward. You can ask yourself, "Where do I feel the Holy Spirit moving in my life?" You can ask yourself, "What am I inspired to do as a result of this spiritual experience?" May those answers produce good fruit for you, St. Andrew, and the whole world.

She was the first one rooting for me as I began answering a call to ministry ten years ago. She has prayed for me far more than I will ever know. And she's loved me through more seasons than I can count where I know I was hard to love. My mom, Sandra, has been the biggest inspiration to me about what it means to take our faith seriously, deeply, and thoughtfully. She's taught me so much, loved me so much, and supported me so much.

I'm also acutely aware that Mother's Day can be a hard and complex day for many of us. For those of us who were close with our mothers and they are no longer living, Mother's Day can be a hard day. For those of us estranged from our mothers - or us mothers estranged from children or grandchildren - Mother's Day can be a hard day. Some of us had mothers who were absent, abusive, or largely unavailable. Mother's Day can be a hard day. Some of us desperately want to be mothers and aren't yet, or aren't able to be in the ways we had hoped. And Mother's Day can be a hard day.

Our God is the God who comes to us because we experience pain, loss, loneliness, and brokenness. He comes to hold it, heal it, and redeem it in the person of Jesus Christ. And so, if this Mother's Day is a hard one, a messy one, a strange one for you, receive a prayer especially for you:

Loving and Tender God,
You love us and gather us into your heart
As a mother hen gathers her chicks into safety and care
Hold us especially in the complexity, the grief, and the messiness of relationships
Soothe the pain of hurt feelings
Mend the wounds that are raw and open
Be a space of refuge to receive the questions, anger, and tears
And then wash over us with peace





### To add a <u>churchlife.mobi</u> shortcut (Android)

- 1. On your mobile device, open the Chrome browser.
- 2. In the Search or type web address field, enter <u>churchlife.mobi</u>.
- 3. When the website displays, tap Ellipsis.
- 4. Tap Add to Home screen.
- 5. In the Add to Home screen field, enter <u>churchlife.mobi</u>, then tap Add.
- 6. To manually place your shortcut on the Home Screen, touch and hold the icon, then place it in a convenient spot. Or, tap Add automatically.

### To add a churchlife.mobi bookmark (iOS)

- 1. On your mobile device, open the Safari app.
- 2. In the Search or enter website name field, enter churchlife.mobi, then tap Go.
- 3. When the website displays, tap Share.
- 4. Tap Add to Home Screen.
- 5. Under Add to Home Screen, enter <u>churchlife.mobi</u>, then tap Add. When finished, the link button displays on your Home screen.
